When signing, remember that context is important. Sign “milk” while feeding your baby a bottle or while nursing—not when you’re doing other things. Sign: Change. “Change” is an important sign because it gives your baby a heads up that you’re transitioning from play to diapering—something he probably won’t want to do.
